MANAGEMENT REPORT OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Financial Highlights – December 31, 2022

This annual Management Report of Fund Performance represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the investment fund's performance and outlook for the period ended December 31, 2022. Every effort has been made to ensure the information contained in this Management Report of Fund Performance is accurate and complete, however, the investment fund cannot guarantee the accuracy or the completeness of this material. For more information, please refer to the TruX Exogenous Risk Pool's Declaration of Trust. In this report, "Manager" refers to True Exposure Investments, Inc., the Manager of the Pool. The "Pool" refers to the TruX Exogenous Risk Pool. In addition, "net asset value" or "NAV" refers to the value of the Pool as calculated for transaction purposes on which the discussion of Pool performance is based. All dollar figures are reported in Canadian dollars.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Pool seeks to provide relative or absolute capital preservation during sudden societal-level shocks that can negatively impact equities along with generating returns that are competitive with equity markets over the longer-term including periods between shocks. The Pool will use alternative investment strategies including borrowing for investment purposes, short selling and the use of derivatives to seek to manage market volatility. The Pool's aggregate exposure to leverage through these strategies will not exceed two times its Net Asset Value ("NAV"), measured on a daily basis. The Pool is subject to certain standard investment restrictions and practices contained in securities legislation, including NI 81-102.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in the Pool remain as discussed in the simplified prospectus. The Pool is suitable for someone who is looking for low to medium risk, a diversified portfolio of alternative investment strategies to hold as part of their balanced portfolio and has a medium-longer-term investment horizon.

For the period ended December 31, 2022, there were no changes affecting the overall level of risk associated with an investment in the Pool; therefore, the overall level of Pool risk and investor risk tolerance remains as stated in the simplified prospectus.

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Results of Operations

The Manager uses a blended benchmark to evaluate the performance of pool. It is important to note that the NAV of the Pool reflects the effect of fees and expenses for professional management, while the benchmark does not have such costs.

The net asset value of the Pool was \$6,745,908 on December 31, 2022, reflecting the capital raised during the period and the changes in NAV due to valuations of the Pool's investments. The Pool had distributions amounting to \$93,303 for the period from January 14, 2022, (commencement of operations) to December 31, 2022.

In 2022 the Pool has outperformed the S&P 500 (SPY) by 14%, a common benchmark for advisors. TERP also outperformed the S&P500 50% hedged to CAD, our internal benchmark, by 19%. TERP remains in a defensive posture with its policy of holding large and highly liquid exchange-traded funds and of avoiding direct counterparty risk from derivatives and securities lending, as we deem such revenue to be unworthy of the risk.

The Pool used three main strategies in order to achieve its objectives in 2022: The Consumer Strategy: a combination a long position in the Consumer Staples sector and a short position in the Consumer Discretionary sector; Specialty Assets: positions in a mixture of gold, treasury bonds and volatility, depending on the market environment; and Tactical Equity: positions in two main US market indices, the S&P 500 and the NASDAQ.

CONSUMER STRATEGY

In past market downturns Consumer Staples performed relatively well due to steady demand, while Consumer Discretionary declined as people reduced optional spending. Over-weighting defensive Staples paired with a short position in Discretionary can offer effective drawdown protection by benefitting from society's behavioural response to stress.

Consumer Staples (XLP) performed its intended role during market weakness by outperforming the S&P500 and defending capital in an absolute sense. Companies in the Staples sector are less vulnerable to inflationary pressure because consumers continue to buy basic necessities even as companies pass through higher input costs.

Consumer Discretionary (XLY) was extremely volatile and underperformed the broad market. As a result, TERP profited from its 30% short position in Discretionary. Supply chain issues disrupted the availability of numerous products, particularly those produced overseas. At the same time, demand fell as consumers deferred purchases. Higher interest rates have consumers attempting to lower debt, a further headwind to Discretionary.

SPECIALTY ASSETS

Specialty Assets are effective diversifiers in benign periods. However, during market shocks and downturns they may also provide powerful protection. Each Speciality Asset is imperfect for this role as they can be volatile, unreliable or most effective in environments that are difficult to forecast. For that reason, TERP has limited positions in up to three.

Gold bullion (VALT.U) performed its intended role in 2022, particularly during the first and fourth quarters. Factors supporting gold were geopolitical uncertainty over the invasion of Ukraine and inflationary concerns. Speculators may also have replaced bitcoin with gold after the former's recent failure as a crisis hedge.

1-3 Year Treasury Bonds (SHY). During the first three quarters, USD rose amidst a flight to safety, then weakened in the fourth quarter. TERP's exposure to USD is currently through short-duration Treasuries, which avoided the worst annual decline in long-term bonds in modern history.

Volatility Index (VIXY) is inversely correlated to the S&P and approximately six times as volatile. VIXY is held when the manager is bullish since, at such time, equity exposure is higher and VIXY provides critical insurance. Since the Pool is already in a defensive posture, VIXY is not owned and is not shown.

TACTICAL EQUITY

Tactical Equity is a core stabilizer to TERP contributing to performance when equities are advancing. This element is required because the Consumer Strategy is highly protective and concentrated. Likewise, Specialty Assets are intended to offset downside risk.

TERP was in its most defensive stance in 2022 preserving capital amidst broad market weakness. NASDAQ suffered especially as large technology stocks collapsed. The S&P and NASDAQ were under-weighted, with NASDAQ at 2/3 of its neutral allocation.

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As prescribed by NI 81-102, the aggregate gross exposure of the Pool, to be calculated as the sum of the following, must not exceed three times the Pool's net asset value: (i) the amount of cash borrowed for investment purposes; (ii) the aggregate market value of physical short sales on equities, fixed income securities or other portfolio assets; and (iii) the aggregate notional value of the Pool's specified derivatives positions excluding any specified derivatives used for hedging purposes.

During the period ended December 31, 2022, the Pool's lowest and highest aggregate gross exposure was 11.7% and 53.2% of the Fund's NAV respectively. As at December 31, 2022, the Pool's aggregate gross exposure was 30% of the Pool's NAV. The primary source of leverage was short sales. The low and high end of the range are as a result of our investing activities, and timing of subscriptions and/or redemptions. The Pool's strategy is outlined in the simplified prospectus.

The Manager monitors, on a daily basis, that the Pool's aggregate gross exposure is less than three times the Pool's net asset value.

Related Party Transactions

Management fees:

The Pool pays the Manager a weekly management fee for providing its services to the Pool. Redeemable units of the Pool, are charged annual management fees equal to the following percentages of the Series NAV of the said Series of the Pool, calculated and accrued on each Valuation Date and payable weekly (except at month-end):

Management fees are subject to applicable taxes, including QST, GST or HST. For the period from January 14, 2022, (commencement of operations) to December 31, 2022, management fees paid by the Pool totalled \$10,614.

(1) This information is derived from the Pool's audited annual financial statements for December 31, 2022, and is not a reconciliation of beginning and ending net assets per unit.

(2) Net assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/(decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period.

(3) Distributions were paid in cash or automatically reinvested in additional units of the Pool, or both.

(4) This information is provided as at December 31, 2022.

(5) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding distributions, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average NAV during the period. During the period ended December 31, 2022, the Manager absorbed \$224,845 in expenses that would have otherwise been charged to the Pool; the MER of each series had these expenses not been absorbed by the Manager would have been as follows:

Prospectus Series: F – 33.403%, N – 3.768%, UN – 3.681%

The Manager will continue this practice until such time as the Pool is of a size to absorb such expenses while maintaining its MER at a competitive level.

(6) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, including any applicable taxes expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average NAV during the period. Included in the trading expense ratio are the forward fees.

(7) The Pool's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Pool's advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Pool buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in the period, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.
